
## Description

**FlickrPhotogallery** allows you to add an image gallery into your posts, using a shortcode, or onto the sidebar(s), with the built-in widget, retrieving images from Flickr.

Once you have installed it, you can choose to use only the shortcode, only the widget, or both; you will also find a new entry under the settings menu, called FlickrPhotogallery.

You can use this one to set the **default parameters** for the shortcode, in order to use it in the [FlickrPhotogallery] form, without adding any additional parameter.

Let's look at it:

1. Defines the source of your images, you can choose to retrieve photos from:
  - Public stream
  - A specific user
  - A specific photoset from a user
  - A specific group
2. If you choose *user*, *photoset* or *group* in the previous field, **you must fill** this one with the Flickr Id of the user or the group from which you want to retrieve images, if you don't know these details don't worry, you can use the link "Find your Flickr Id" or you can use **Flindr**.
3. This link is almost magic, once you clicked it, the windows appeared with the user or the group URL and click on OK, you will find your id into the id field.
4. If you choose the photoset option, you must fill this field with the Id of the selected photoset. To find it is quite simple: a typical photoset url is something like this:  
<http://www.flickr.com/photos/tizianobasile/sets/72157628666491859>  
you just have to copy the number after "sets/", in this case "72157628666491859"
5. Here you can choose how many images to show in your gallery
6. If you want to add a short description to your gallery, this is the right field, it will be printed before the gallery in a **H3 tag**
7. Here you can select how to show your gallery, you can choose between:
  - List-items
  - Slideshow
8. If you selected the slideshow before, you must specify its dimension, don't worry about the photos, they will always be at the highest possible quality
9. You can specify a border color for the gallery using a convenient color-picker
10. What will happen if the user clicks on an image? Here you can choose if to redirect him to the relative Flickr page or to use an elegant Fancybox effect.

The widget has a similar admin panel, so I won't talk about it.

In the post edit page you will also find two buttons in the visual mode, use them to put a shortcode into your post, the first adds it without parameters, the second allows you to edit parameters if you want to insert a gallery with different options than the defaults.

## Installation

The installation of FlickrPhotogallery is quite simple, just copy the FlickrPhotogallery folder into the '/wp-content/plugins/' directory of your site and activate the plugin in the relative panel.

Very simple, isn't it? :-)
